In continuing the tradition of service, we are offering scholarships in the amount of up to \$2,000.00. By offering this award we hope to encourage and reward academic achievement by providing financial assistance to students pursuing higher education.

Applicants must meet the following requirements:

Eligibility: An applicant must be enrolled at an accredited community college, or four-year university in the Fall of 2026 and must have a minimum grade point average of 2.5. Applicants must also be a current or former foster youth.

Application: An applicant must submit a **typewritten** application accompanied by **an official transcript as well as an essay**. The essay (two to three, double-spaced, typewritten pages) should state your educational goals, career aspirations, and any information expressing financial need. Please identify social barriers that impact youth within the foster care system and how gaining an education can aid in alleviating this issue.

Photograph: An applicant must submit a photograph of themselves if selected for the scholarship. **Please sign the photograph/video consent form within the application.**

Deadline: Applicant must return all material no later than **May 24, 2026**, Applications submitted electronically after May 24, 2026, will not be considered.

Selection Procedure: The Education/Scholarship Committee will review each application, and a winner will be notified electronically by the end of June.

Awards: **Each recipient will be required to submit proof of full-time enrollment for the Fall of 2026 semester/quarter from an accredited community college or four-year institution.** Proof of enrollment qualifies as a letter or course print-out from the university's registrar's office. Scholarship checks will not be issued until proof of enrollment is received.
